## Marijuana Updates

- New York State's Democratic-led Assembly and the Senate Independent Democratic Conference (IDC) joined with the Governor to assert the need to close the marijuana "public view" loophole and seal past arrests for problematic enforcement in this year's budget legislation. ## Beyond the Numbers

Each month in this newsletter we will share the personal stories of the people who are being directly impacted by New York's marijuana policies. Their full names will not be shared.



**The Bronx, New York** - While celebrating a friend's birthday, Carlos decided to step outside to smoke a cigarette with two friends. He noticed that there were other people standing outside the building but paid no mind to their presence until the police rapidly approached the building. Upon seeing the police, the people ahead of Carlos ran. With no reason to flee, Carlos stayed where he was.

When the police reached the front of the building they began to question

him about the people that ran off. Carlos did not know the people, and made that fact clear to the police. The officers did not believe him and grew frustrated. Carlos tried for 20 minutes to prove his innocence. Unconvinced, the police officers frisked Carlos. They found nothing. They did, however, spot a clip of marijuana on the ground and asserted that it belonged to Carlos.

He was arrested on sight and spent 5 hours at the precinct. He was charged with possession of marijuana. While the judge granted Carlos an Adjournment in Contemplation of Dismissal (ACD) because it was his first arrest, Carlos ended up missing two days of work because of the arrest and his court appearance.



### **Why is marijuana legalization a SMART choice for New York?**

“Ending marijuana prohibition is a SMART choice for New York because prohibition has come at a disproportionately high cost to our communities of color. Making marijuana legal and regulating it for adult use will save money that could provide resources necessary to rebuild these communities that have been devastated by mass incarceration and lack of access to opportunities. California and Colorado are using their marijuana tax revenue to rebuild schools and community centers while New York closes them down. Prohibition has to end.”
